JEHOVAH ROHI OUR SHEPHERD LESSON TWELVE

Meditation

The LORD is my Shepherd, I shall lack nothing. He makes me lie down in green pastures, He leads me beside quiet waters, He restores my soul. - Psalm 23:1-2

Main Theme

Jehovah Rohi means "God, the Shepherd." In Psalm 23, David said, "The LORD is my Shepherd." He is our Shepherd, too, and we will begin to meet Him beside the still waters where we as the sheep of His pasture need Him to lead us, to feed us, and to care for us. The primary meaning of the word rohi is "to feed." A second meaning of the word rohi refers to the relationship between a leader and his people. Sheep do not know how to protect themselves, are directionless, and have little sense of danger. They depend on their shepherd to protect them, feed them, and to care for them. Isaiah said, "We all, like sheep, have gone astray."(Isaiah 53:6) How easily we do go astray from the Lord! We end our study together with the revelation of God as Jehovah Rohi, our Shepherd. Not only has He been revealing Himself to us through His names, but He has also been tenderly leading us beside still waters.

II. Jehovah Rohi Feeds Us

• Key Passage: John 6:48

Jehovah Rohi feeds us with His Word. The promises in the Word of God feed our souls and instruct us in the way we should go. Jesus Christ said that He was the "living bread come down from heaven." (John 6:41) Throughout the Scriptures, we see God's provision to feed His people with both physical and spiritual bread. For example, the Israelites had manna in the wilderness (physical) and Jesus Christ came as living bread, proclaiming that if we eat of this bread, we will live forever (spiritual). III. Jehovah Rohi Cares for Us

Key Passage: John 6:48-51

Jehovah Rohi, our Shepherd, searches for His lost sheep, those who don't know Him. He also binds up the wounded. The prophet Isaiah prophesied that the Messiah would come to "bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives." (Isaiah 61:1-2) Jesus Christ came as the fulfillment of that prophecy. He was the One who was sent to care for us as our Great Shepherd. (Luke 4:18) He tells us to cast all of our anxieties on Him because He cares for us. (I Peter 5:7)

Sheep follow the shepherd and are confident that he will care

for them and lead them to green pastures. As we begin to
know and trust the Lord to care for us, our lives will be filled
with peace and confidence.
